Do you work in a GP practice that uses TPP SystemOne?


Do you access CHIE?

Did you know that single sign on functionality is now available to all GP Practices using TPP SystemOne?

Single Sign On means that users no longer need to use a separate user name and password to log into CHIE. You can now view CHIE data by clicking a link from within the patient record in SystemOne.

Louise Heybourne, IT Manager at Ringwood Medical Centre (who have recently enabled the Single Sign On functionality), said:

"one click and our users have sight of HHR. So useful for the admin teams when uploading care plans and it means that clinicians using SSO do not have to remember or reset any passwords – hurray. A great step forward for sharing records through IT".
